 gods age of twenty years, Item I give unto my said son John Howell all my books of
 great Table and frame in the hall and the lictory table house and the Table and frame and
 lictory Table in the coloure of lictory Chubbore in my lictory Chamber and a great Iron pot
 and the residue of my goods chattels and whatsoevyr not before given my debts paid my
 legacies performed and my body lawfully buried I give and bequeath unto my wife
 whom I ordeyne and make full and sole executrix of this my last will and Testament
 Executors of this my last will and Testament I ordeyne and appoynt my trusty and
 welbelovyd freinds and Brethren Thomas Stone William Browne Edward Howell
 and John Howell, witnesses to this will, Justice Browne, John Stone James Long
 first this mark.

In the name of God Amen Edward Allegre of
 the County of Kent beinge sick in body but of good and perfect
 remembrance God be prayd for it doe make and ordeyne this my last will and
 Testament in manner and forme followinge, first I comitt my soule unto Almighty
 God the Creator and preserver thereof, expyng to be saved by the only meritt of
 Jhesu my saviour, And my body to be carryed from whence it came, Item I
 give and bequeath to the poore people of the County of Kent to be divided amongst
 hym at the tyme of my buryall or within thre monethes after by myne Executor or
 I give and bequeath to Anna my wyfe the sum of my house hold stuffe wch shall make
 the sum of 100 lb. to be prayd within one moneth after my decease to the
 use of the said Anna, Item I give unto Marguerit Moore my neyther
 Item I give unto my son Thomas an hundred poundes wch he shall fully accomplish
 the age of one and twenty years so that he make not charge of any sume or sumes
 of moneth that is put out in Gods name by me to this last to any person or persons and
 also myne reasonable maintenance in the meantime tyme as myne Executors shall think
 fitt, Item I give unto my son Edward two hundred poundes to be paid within four
 years after my decease if makinge a sufficient discharge of all sumes of moneth
 due unto hym at or before the said tyme wch he shall be requyred to receave by
 myne Executor and to give to myne Executor sufficient authority to receive the
 same, Item all the rest of my moveable goods Chattels and whatsoevyr not
 before my debts legacies and funerall expences beinge paid and discharged I give
 and bequeath unto my son William Allegre wch I make and ordeyne my sole
 Executor of this my last will and Testament, And if he doe happen to dye before my
 debts and legacies be paid then my will is that Edward shall be my Executor, Item I
 requyre William Relict of the County of Kent my brother, John Allegre of
 the County of Kent and my brother Thomas Browne gent to be Executors of
 this my last will and Testament and to be chalpyng and ordyng unto myne Executor in
 performinge this my last will and Testament.

This is also the last will and Testament of me Edward Algon alias Algonut aforesaid & containing my lands and Tenements whatsoever, first my will and mynt is that mynors & mynors agred and bargayned wth my brother John Algonut of Bonington Monastrey in the County aforesaid gent for all that his Messuage and landes in Horsmonden aforesaid & commonly called Kethles, in the occupation of George Dukes that he said John Algonut shall & shalld be same to the use of Anna my wyfe untill my sonne John Algonut shall accomplish the age of Twentie out yeres is he so longe he live towards the madynour and he mayntenance and bringinge upp of mynors youngest children, so that hee make a releas of all his interest in all my landes w^{ch} in hert monethes after my decease w^{ch} hee shall hereunto requyre by mynors executor otherwise I give the profitte thereof to the use of my sonne William duringe the said tyme that Anna my wyfe shall enjoy the same. And mynors said sonne John shall accomplish the full age of Twentie out yeres or at the decease of Anna my wyfe w^{ch} shall first happen to the use and benefite of my said sonne John and his heirs, provided always that my said sonne John shall paye unto my daughter Francke and Anna to the use of them an hundred poundes a yere or to the use assigned w^{ch} they shall accomplish the age of Twentie out yeres is hee be then livinge or have any child or children livinge, And my will is that my said sonne John shall paye unto Anna my wyfe Twentie poundes by the yere quarterly to be paid by equalle portions duringe her naturall lyfe is hee releas the interest in mynors other landes, otherwise to be payde unto my sonne William for that tyme, And if it so happen my sonne John to dye before hee shall accomplish the full age of Twentie out yeres, & then my will and mynt is that Anna my wyfe shall have the full fruite and profitte of the said Messuage duringe her naturall lyfe conditionally as aforesaid, And after her decease to Edward my sonne and his heirs paymte to my two daughters as aforesaid two hundred poundes w^{ch} they shall accomplish the age aforesaid, And for default of payment w^{ch} in two monethes after hee aged aforesaid, my will is that the said Messuage shall be made over to the use of my said two daughters and their heirs, then I give to my sonne Robert my Tutor and all my landes now in the tenure and occupation of John Burpiter or his or assigned of Horsmonden aforesaid duringe his naturall lyfe, And after his decease to my sonne William and to his heirs for ever, All the residue of my landes tenements and conditionally whatsoever I give and bequeath to my sonne William and his heirs for ever, paymte my debts and legacies and paymte unto my brother John Algonut aforesaid w^{ch} hee shall be assured of the Messuage and landes in Horsmonden aforesaid according to the true intent and meaning of his my last will and Testament the same of Eight hundred and sixtie poundes, And if my said brother John Algonut doth refuse to make an assurance of the said Messuage and landes according to our bargaine and agreement to the true intent and meaning of his my will and Testament, then my will is that my said sonne William shall paye to mynors youngest children, John, Francke, and Anna out hundred poundes a yere w^{ch} they shall accomplish the age of Twentie out yeres, provided always that if my sonne William shall not paye my legacies according to the true intent and meaning of his my will and Testament, then my will is that my sonne Edward shall have the messuages and landes before bequeathed (unto my said sonne William) to him and his heirs my said sonne Edward paymte my legacies as aforesaid, And if my sonne Edward also shall not paye my legacies as aforesaid, then my will is that my said sonne John shall have the messuages and landes before bequeathed unto my said sonne William to him and his heirs for ever, paymte my legacies as aforesaid, Edward Algon alias Algonut/ Sealed and published in the presence of John Algon, Robt factson, and John Osee his marks.
