I John Althorne of Broughton in the County of Kent Esq. being in reason-
able good health considering my great age of eighty yeares and upwards yet of sound
mind and memory doe this present eighth day of November In the yeare of our Lord
God according to the Computacion of the Church of England One Thousand Six
hundred Eighty and Six. make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner
and forme following First I Commend my soule into the hands of Almighty God and
Creator hoping to attaine eternall salvation in and through the merits and passion of
his sonne the word Jesus Christ And as touching the disposition of my personall estate
consisting of ready money plate rings scales and all my household goods whatsoever
I doe give and bequeath the same unto my dearly beloved wife Mary Althorne
to bee by her disposed of as shalbe shall thinke fit And all the rest and residue of my
goods and chattels after my debts legacies and funerall expences are satisfied and paid I
doe likewise give and bequeath unto my said dearly beloved wife and to my daughter
Anne Savage whom I doe hereby make joint Executrixes of this my Will And as
touching and concerning my real estate consisting of Messuages Lands and Tenements
not already by Act executed settled and disposed of I doe by these presents give and
devise the same with all and singular their Appurtenances as hereafter followeth And
First I doe give and devise unto my said beloved wife Mary Althorne All that my
Capitall Messuage wherein I now dwell with all the barnes and outhouses orchards
gardens and Hedgewardens and all other the lands thereunto belonging or therewith
bonally occupied or enjoyed and two other Messuages or Tenements with the lands
thereunto respectively belonging one of them being last in the occupation of the widdow
Agnes and now in my owne occupation and the other alsoe in my owne occupation commonly
called the lower house And the lands below the Will heretofore in the occupation of
Christopher Buringer and are now alsoe in my owne occupation with their and every of
their Appurtenances All which before mentioned Messuages lands and premises with
the Appurtenances are situate lying and being in the Parishes of Broughton in the County
of Kent or one of them in the County of Kent aforesaid And alsoe all that ffarme
and lands in the occupation of John Smyth yeoman And alsoe one other ffarme and lands
late in the occupation of Michael Judd and now in my owne occupation both which said
last mentioned ffarmes are situate lying and being in the severall Parishes of Boxley
Sudger Sillingham and Chatham or some or one of them in the County aforesaid And
all the Woodlands lying or adjoining to or neare the said lands and premises and are
now in my owne occupation And alsoe all that my ffarme and lands lying and being in
the Parish of Marden in the said County commonly called or knowne by the name of
Waldens now in the Occupation of Thomas Reynolds yeoman And alsoe one other ffarme

with all the lands thereto belonging now in the occupation of Richard Warde yeoman
 lying and being in Marden aforesaid with all and singular the appurtenances unto the
 said last mentioned farms respectively belonging or therewith usually left occupied or
 enjoyed And lastly one other farm commonly called or known by the name of Warpers
 with all the lands thereto belonging or therewith usually left or enjoyed now in the occupation
 of Thomas Clont yeoman situate lying and being in the Parish of Cowdinst in the
 County aforesaid To have and To hold all and singular the before mentioned Messuages
 farms lands Tenements and appurtenances whatsoever with all and singular their
 appurtenances unto the aforesaid Mary Withom my wife for and during the Term
 of her naturall life And after the decease of her the said Mary Withom Then as
 for touching and concerning the two respective farms aforesaid now late in the
 several occupations of the aforesaid John Smyth and Michael Hudd and the Wood
 lands thereto belonging in my owne occupation I give and devise the same as hereafter
 followeth that is to say unto my daughter Anne Savage now wife of John Savage Ben fac
 and during the term of her naturall life without impeachment of or for any manner of waste
 And from and after her decease Then I give and devise all the said farm late in the occupation
 of the said Michael Hudd and the Woodlands thereto belonging in my owne occupation
 except such and soe much of the said farm and lands as are lying and being in the Parish
 of Bopley aforesaid unto my Grandchild John Savage eldest sonne of the said John
 Savage and Anne his said wife and the heirs of the body of the said John Savage the
 same lawfully to bee begotten and for default of such heirs then I doe give and devise
 the same unto Richard Savage younger sonne of him the said John Savage the father by
 Anne his said wife and to the heirs of the body of him the said Richard Savage lawfully
 to bee begotten And for want of such Issue then to the said Anne Savage my daughter
 and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten and for default of such Issue the remainder
 to mee the said John Withom my heirs and Assignes for ever And as touching my said
 other farm in the occupation of the said John Smyth and such and soe much of the said
 farm and lands abovementioned late in the occupation of the said Michael Hudd and
 now in my owne occupation as are lying and being in the Parish of Bopley aforesaid
 from and after the decease of my said daughter Anne Savage I doe give the same unto
 Richard Savage her said younger sonne and to the heirs of his body lawfully to bee begotten
 And for want of such Issue then unto John Savage his said elder brother and the heirs
 of his body lawfully to bee begotten And for default of such Issue then to my said
 daughter Anne Savage and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten And for default of
 such Issue Remainder to mee the said John Withom my heirs and Assignes for ever
 And as touching and concerning my said farm called Warpers and all the lands thereto
 belonging in Cowdinst aforesaid in the occupation of the said Thomas Clont I doe
 give and devise the same from and after the decease of the said Mary Withom my wife
 unto my aforesaid Grandchild Richard Savage and the heirs of his body lawfully to bee
 begotten And for want of such Issue then to John Savage his brother and the heirs of
 his body lawfully to bee begotten And for want of such Issue then to my aforesaid daughter
 Anne Savage and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten And in default of such Issue
 the Remainder to my right heirs for ever And as touching and concerning all that my
 aforesaid Capitall Messuage wherein I dwell with all the Parks and orchards outwards
 gardens and doogardens and all other the lands thereto belonging or therewith usually
 enjoyed as aforesaid situate and being in Boughton Mentheloke and Doose aforesaid
 And alsoe the aforesaid two other Messuages with the lands thereto respectively belonging
 one of them being heretofore in the possession of the Devidden ffrere aforesaid and the other
 in my owne occupation commonly called the lower house and the lands belowe the spill in
 Boughton aforesaid late in the Occupation of the said Christopher Brongter with all
 and singular their and every of their appurtenances situate and lying in the said Parishes
 of Boughton and Doose or one of them And alsoe all that my farme before mentioned

together with all the lands therunto belonging commonly called or knowne by the name of
 Swallows in the occupation of Thomas Reynolds And the said other ffarme with the
 lands therunto belonging in the occupation of Richard Darke aforesaid and both situate
 and being in Marden aforesaid I doe give and devise the same with all and singular the
 appurtenances from and after the decease of the said Mary my wife in manner following
 that is to say unto my said Grandchild Richard Savage for and during the Terme of
 his naturall life the remainder to John Butcher of West Wetham in the County aforesaid
 Esq. and William Binet of Vinton in the said County Esq. for and during the terme
 of Eighty yeares if yett the said Richard Savage shall not long live To the only intent
 to preserve the contingent estates hereinafter to bee limited from being cut off and destroyed
 by him the said Richard and for that purpose to make enties to revert the same as occasion
 shall require and according to my true intent in this my said bill expressed And from
 and after the determination of the said estate for yeares and decease of the said Richard
 then to the only use and behoofe of the first sonne of the body of him the said Richard to
 bee begotten and the heires of the body of such first sonne lawfully to bee begotten And
 for default of such issue then to the use of the second sonne of the body of him the said
 Richard to bee begotten and to the heires of the body of such second sonne lawfully to bee
 begotten And for default of such issue of such second sonne then to the use and
 behoofe of the third fourth fifth and sixth and all and every other sonne and sonnes of
 the body of the said Richard to bee begotten severally and successively one after
 another as they and every of them shall bee in seniority and priority of birth and of the
 severall and respective heires of the body of all and every such first and every other
 sonne and sonnes issuing the elder of such sonnes and the heires of his body being
 aliveayes preferred before the younger of such sonnes and the heires of his body issuing
 And for default of such issue as aforesaid then to all and every daughter and daughters
 of him the said Richard and the heires of their respective bodies lawfully to bee begotten
 and equally to bee divided betwene them And for default of such issue then I give all
 and singular the aforesaid Mesuages ffarmes lands and premises with the appurtenances
 to the right heires of my aforesaid daughter Anne Savage for ever Nevertheless it is
 my true intent and meaning And I doe further declare this to bee my will that in case
 the said Mary my wife shall depart this life before the said Richard Savage shall
 attaine his full age of one and twenty yeares That then my said sonne in law John
 Savage father of him the said Richard and George Maplisden of Marden aforesaid
 Esq. and the survivor of them shall take and receive the rents issues and profits of all and
 singular the Mesuages ffarmes lands and premises aforesaid other then such as are
 given as aforesaid to the said Anne Savage for her life and afterwards to her two sonnes
 in manner as aforesaid untill my said Grandchild Richard Savage shall attaine his said
 age of one and twenty yeares and out of the said rents and profits shall raise and pay the
 summe of One hundred pounds unto my Grandchild Elizabeth Savage the only daughter
 of my said daughter Anne Savage and the summe shall bee paid by my said
 Trustees to my aforesaid Grandson Richard Savage at his said age of one and
 twenty yeares other then what shall bee by them laid out and expended for his maintenance
 and education And further my will is that my said Trustees shall deliver up the quiet
 possession of the said Mesuages ffarmes and premises unto my said Grandchild Richard
 Savage at his said age of one and twenty yeares and in the meane time they the said Trustees
 or either of them shall not lett out any Quarries belonging to any parte of the premises
 to digg stone therein nor shall they or either of them commit any wast on the premises either
 in destruction of the houses cutting downe the Timber Trees thereon growing ploughing by
 the meadows or otherwise howsoever And if my said Trustees or either of them shall
 plough upp or raise to bee ploughed the Tame Meadowe or two other Meadowes
 therunto adjoining the feild commonly called the Broadfeild the meadow called the
 Bladfeild the meadow over against the house the Cherry garden or Outwards to the

said Capitall Messuage belonging or any parte thereof then for every one or lesser proportion set ploughed upp they shall pay the summe of ten shillings unto the Overseers of the poore of Boughdon Mennielca aforesaid for the only use and benefit of the poore of the said Parish And lastly my Will is that my said Executors shall bee allowed their reasonable costs and charges for and in respect of the due execution of their said Will out of the rents and profits aforesaid I give unto my daughter Mary Whitton the summe of Ten pounds if shee bee living at the time of my decess To my Godson George Maphiden sonne of George Maphiden of Mardn aforesaid Esq. I give the summe of five pounds To such of my servants as shall bee dwelling with me in my house at the time of my death I give five shillings apiece Item I give to such and so many of the poore of Boughdon aforesaid as my aforesaid Executors in their discretions shall thinke fitt which have not reliefe of the said Parish and were borne there the summe of three pounds And I doe hereby revoke Comtmand and annul all former and other Will and Wills by me at any time before made published or ordyned John Whitton. Sealed and Published by me John Whitton and my name subscribed unto every sheete beinge foure in number In the presence of Tobias Young, William Buryard, Isaac Kemp, Elmor Cary.

I Sir John Comre of Otterden in the County of Kent Baronet beinge indisposed in bodily health but of good and perfect mind and memory Draught bee Almighty God for the same And knowinge the uncertainty and frailty of this mortall life that all men must die And beinge desirous to settle order and dispose that I would saye wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me as is hereafter mentioned and declared doe make ordaine and constitute this my last Will and Testament in manner followinge hereby revokinge and annulling and every other Will or Wills or Declaration or Declaration in the name of Will or Wills by me at any time heretofore made And first I recommend my soule into the hands of Almighty God my maker hopinge assuredly in and through the alone merits death and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to obtaine full and free pardon and remission of all my sinns and bee made partaker of his heavenly Kingdome And my body I give to the earth from whence it came to bee decently and in Christian manner interred in the small burying place in Otterden aforesaid at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named with sure hope to receive it againe at the resurrection of the Just And as to the worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to endow me I devise bequeath and bequeath the same in manner followinge In witness whereof I am by good and sufficient Comynes and Assurances in Law seized to mee and my Executors of an absolute and indivisible estate of Inheritance in fee simple of and in several Messuages houses Burgages Lands and Tenements with their Appurtenances situate standing and beinge in Severall Streetes alias Crosses Church Streete in or near the City of London As also of and in All those my Lands Tenements Burgages and Advowsons with their and every of their or
