The Twentieth Day of October in the year of  
our Lord god 1617. I John Alchorne of Broughton Mouchelster in the Dioces of Canterberie in the  
County of Kent gent. being of good health and perfect memorie thanks be to god, doe make this my  
present Testament and last will in manner and forme followinge That is to saye first I bequeath my  
soule to almighty god my maker and Redeemer hopinge to be saved by the merits of Ihesus Christe and  
passion. Item I give to a sufficient preacher to make a sermon at my buriall Twentie Shillings Item I  
give to the poore people of the parish where I shall be buried fortie Shillings And to the poore of  
the parish of Brentchelsey fortie Shillings to be distributed by the discretion of my executor Item  
I give to my wife my lease of the landes in Romney Marsh which some tyme were m<sup>r</sup>. Henry  
Christie some tyme her husband Item I give to willm yonge Eslder of the parish of Loost Thre  
poundes And to his sonne Ralph yonge Twentie Shillings Item I give to Edward Alchorn and Robt  
Alchorne to each of them a Cloake Item I give to e verie of my three daughters a gowne Item I give  
to Edward Alchorn a chest standinge in my chamber where I lye with all his writings in yt all the  
give to Robert Alchorn my some my chest standinge by my bed side in my chamber where I lye with  
all the writings in yt which chest was my some in lawe my chest yonge ff. all the residue of my  
goodes and Chattells moveables and immoveables what soever I give to John Alchorn my eldest some  
except my ringe and my plate which I give to John Alchorne my god some which said John Alchorne  
my eldest some I make my sole Executor payinge my debts and legacies and seeinge my funerall discharged  
This is the last will of me the said John Alchorne made the daye and yeare abovesaid concerninge  
the disposicion of all my Lande tenements and hereditaments Item I give and bequeath unto Agnes  
Walster my daughter all thes my Landes and tenements which I bought of Thomas Swinocke  
one of the Jurats of the towne of Maydstone in the County of Kent aforesaid to have and to  
hold to her duringe the whole terme of her naturall life. And after her decease I will yt to re-  
maine to Agnes Walster her daughter and to the heires of her bodie lawfullie begotten And for  
lacke of such issue I will yt to remaine to John Walster her brother and to the heires of his bodie  
lawfullie begotten and for lacke of such issue I will yt to remaine to Agnes Walster my daughter  
and to the heires of her bodie lawfullie begotten Item I give and bequeath to Robert Alchorne my  
some all my howses me shages Landes and tenements in Maydstone which I bought of John Alchorne  
my some to have and to hold to him the said Robert and to his heires payinge to John Walster some of  
Ralph Walster the some of Twentie poundes of lawfull English money within two yeares after my decease  
And also payinge unto Agnes Walster tenne poundes of like money within one yeare after my decease  
which said Agnes is his sister Item I give and bequeath more to the said Robert my some all my  
Landes and woodlands in the parish of East Starley to have to him and to his heires for ever. All  
the residue of my manors me shages Landes tenements what soever and whosoever I  
will and bequeath to my eldest some John Alchorne and to his heires and assignes for ever.
