This Will was proved at London the ninth day of September
in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty eight
before the Reverend and Excellent Doctor of Laws Sir George
of the Right Honourable Sir George Lee Knight Doctor of Laws
Master Receiver or Commissary of the prerogative Court of
Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oaths of Henry Cotton the
Brother of the deceased and Thomas Cooper the Executors named
in the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and
singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the deceased having
been first sworn duly to administer.

Philip Alchorne of Oxford in the County of Oxenham being
infirm in Body out of a sound and disposing Mind Memory and
Understanding praised be Almighty God for the same do therefore
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following that is to say first and principally I resign my Soul
to God who gave it and my Body to the Earth to be decently
buried at the Discretion of my Executor hereinafter named
and as to the temporal Estate which it hath pleased God to
bestow upon me with I give and dispose thereof as followeth first to order
that all my just Debts be first paid and discharged then I give and
bequeath unto my son Richard Alchorne the Sum of Sixty pounds
of lawful Money of Great Britain to be paid him by my Executor
hereinafter named within Six Months next after my decease
then all my Household Goods and furniture of plate ready
Money Debts owing me and all other my Goods and Chattels and
Personal Estate whatsoever and whosoever that I shall dye
possessed of or interested in I give and bequeath unto my son
Samuel Alchorne forever and I hereby nominate constitute
and appoint my said son Samuel Alchorne full and sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making
void all former Wills and Bequests by me at any time heretofore
made in witness whereof the said Philip Alchorne his Testator
has to this my last Will and Testament contained in one sheet
of Paper set my hand and seal this tenth day of July in the thirty
second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the
second by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland
King Defender of the Faith and so forth and in the year of our

Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty eight. Phil. Althorne
Signed Sealed published and declared by the said Testator as his last
Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence and

Right Honourable Sir George Lee Knight Doctor of Laws Master
Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Cantorbury lawfully
constituted by the Oath of Samuel Althorne the Son of the deceased and
sole Executor named in the said Will to whom Administration was
granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the
deceased having been first sworn duly to administer. /s/
