 the ffifteenth and thirtieth yere of the Reigne of our Soueraigne Ladye Elizabeth by the grace of
 god Queene of England France and Ireland Defendour of the faith etc. I Francis
 Alchin of Marden in the County of Kent and Dioces of Canturbury being weak in bodye
 but of good and perfect remembrance to wit he given vnto Almighty god therefore doe
 make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme following. First
 of all bequeathing my Soule into the handes of Almighty god my Creator Redeemer and
 Sanctifier steadfastly trusting and believing that by the precious bloodshedding of his Sonne
 Iesus against all my finnes and offences are freely pardoned and forgiven me. And my Soule to be
 buried wheresoever it shall please god to appointe. Item I give vnto the poore people of the parishes
 of Marden aforesaid three shilling four pence to be bestowed amonge them within one month after
 my decease at the discretion of mine Executors. Item I give vnto my Sonne John Alchin my best
 Joyued Bedstall, one ffetherhall one ffether holster one ffether pillow one payre of blawette
 one Coverlett and one fyne payre of sheetes to be deliuered vnto him at his age of one and twenty
 yeres. Item I give and bequeathe vnto Richard Waggoner Coloured Clothe of Aldersgate my
 Brother in Lawe my dublett and best of dyse dols and my gearre coloured Clothe to be deliuered
 vnto him within one quarter of a yere after my decease. Item I will and bequeathe vnto my

Father in Lawe John Marlely my best Oloft. And I also ordayne him the said John Marlely
my Executor. All the residue of my moveable goods Chattells ready money and plate I give unto
Sara Alghin my wyfe. In witness whereof I the said Thomas Alghin have set to my hande and
scale the daye and yere first above written. These beinge witnesses William Shollinson William
Tayle and Salmon Paper minister of Marden.

This is the last Will and

Testament of me the said Thomas Alghin made and declared the daye and yere above said
touching the Disposition of my messuages or tenement and all and singular my Landes in
Marden aforesaid. Item my will and munde is for the answering and Discharging of my Debte &
Legacis and other charges whatsoever beinge indebted to sondays persons that mine Executor
abovenamed John Marlely shall have full power and auctorite to make sale of the pcedes or
partell of Lande with a Lodge therupon unto any manner of person or persons whome pcedes
or partell of Lande ruggly descended and came unto me the said Thomas Alghin by the last will
and Testament of Robert Alghin my Father of wden date deceased touching by Edward twenty
five acres of Lande more or lesse, and whiche now is in the occupation of the said John Marlely mine
Executor abutting unto other Landes of me the said Thomas Alghin and of Samuel Lane gent against
the North to the Landes of John Hodges, and of the Deane and Chapter of Loughborow against the
South to the Landes of Edward Woodston Knight against the East and to the Rucnes
gigge streete there against the West as the metes and boundes thereof on every side are devised
shewe forth with all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging whatsoever. And if it
shall so fall oute that after the sale of the said five pcedes or partell of Lande and the Lodge
therupon the same of money for the whiche they shalbe sold for shall not amounte to the sume of
money that my Debte Legacis and other charges shall extende unto then my will and munde is
that to munge money so shalbe wanting for the compassing and Discharging of all such Debte
Legacis and other charges as mine Executor may be burthened and charged with all over
and beside the receipte of money for the aforesaid five pcedes or partell of Lande, and the
Lodge therupon the same shalbe answered and paid oute of the moveable goods Chattells and
ready money before given unto Sara Alghin my wyfe. So that my will and munde is that
mine Executor shall not be priveded or burthened any manner of waye. Item I give and
bequeathe unto Sara Alghin my wyfe three pcedes or partell of Lande whiche are called
the twoe Hamstork meades the Little Hamstork and greate Hamstork the thre Shurche
fildes the four the longe reced, and the fift the Little Droffe adjoining to them to have and
to hold the said five pcedes and partell of Lande unto her the said Sara and to her
Assignes untill such tyme as my Sonne John shall accomplish the full age of one and twenty
yeres makinge no stryppes nor waiste upon the said Landes but onely to pcedes and take so
sufficient hedgebaste and other curlosure for the said Landes from tyme to tyme duringe all
the said tyme. Item I give unto my Sonne John Alghin the foresaid five pcedes or
partell of Lande before bequeathed called the twoe Hamstork meades the Shurche fildes the
longe reced and the Little Droffe when he shall accomplish his full age of one and twenty
yeres to have and to hold the said five pcedes and partell of Lande unto him and to his
heires in fee simple for ever. And if it shall for tyme that my said Sonne John shall not live
unto the said age of one and twenty yeres then I give and bequeathe unto my wyfe Sara
so surviving her said Sonne the foresaid three pcedes or partell of Lande duringe all the tyme and
tyme of her naturall lyfe makinge no waiste but takinge sufficient closure as aforesaid. And after
the decease of my said wyfe and after the decease of my said Sonne so descending withoute heires
of his body lawfully begotten I will the said three pcedes of Lande unto my Brother Edward
Alghin and his heires for ever. Item I will give and bequeathe unto my wyfe Sara Alghin
my Mansioun house or tenement in Marden aforesaid with all the Eastment and housing therunto
belonging one overhards and tyme pcedes or partell of Lande with appurtenances therunto

belonging to the same by estimation twenty and five acres of Land more or less and also one small tenement with a garden plot thereto belonging now in the tenure and occupation of one Jasper Fogge also known in Merden aforesaid. To have and to hold the said premises with the appurtenances to them belonging unto the said Sara and her assigns until such time as the said John Alquin my sonne shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years upon this condition notwithstanding standing hereunder following viz That the said Sara or her assigns do pay or cause to be paid yearly unto Merrie Lechmy of Apswey my mother according unto my Statutes will one Annuitie or yearly Rent of some pounds. And also upon this condition that if my said mother shall departe this natural life before the said John my sonne shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years that then from the time of my said mothers departure the said Sara my wyfe do yearly paye oute of the said two tenements and some acres of Land with the appurtenances unto the use of my said sonne John for his case and raising of a stocke of money for him the full sume of five poundes which I will shall remayne in the hands of mine Executors to be paid unto my foresaid sonne John at his foresaid age of one and twenty years. Also my will and minde is that the said Sara my wyfe during all the said termes from time to time shall well and sufficiently mainteine susteine and upholde all the housing of the said premises both with reparacion and refection taking upon the said five and twenty acres of Land sufficient timber. And also shall repaie and make the hedges and enclosures of the said Land having in and upon the premises sufficient tymmer for the enclosure thereof. And I give and bequeathe unto my foresaid sonne John Alquin if he shall accomplish the full age of one and twenty years all the my mansion dwelling house and that other small tenement with all the housing thereto belonging and the foresaid orchards and some acres or partilly of Land containing by estimation twenty five acres of Land with all and singular the appurtenances unto them belonging to him and to his heires in fee simple for ever. And if it shall so happen that my said sonne shall departe this life before he shall accomplish the full age of one and twenty years or that then my will and minde is that Sara my wyfe surviving my sonne shall enjoye the said two tenements and Land next before given with the appurtenances whatsover until such time as my said sonne shall have bene of age of xxij years yf he had lived so longe paying to my mother as aforesaid and repaying and susteyning the houses and fencing the Land as aforesaid. And then that terme of years so expressed and if my said sonne be deceased I do give the said two tenements one orchard and some acres or partilly of Land containing by estimation twenty five acres of Land more or less with all and singular the appurtenances unto them belonging unto my Brother Edward Alquin of Horsmonden and to his heires in fee simple for ever. And I ordeined and bequeathed that the said gift made unto my said Brother Edward shall upon this condition that the said Edward or his heires do paye or cause to be paid unto my sister Anne Wagborne or her heires thirty poundes of good and Lawfull money of England within one year next after the said Edward shall enjoye the said premises. And also the said Edward or his heires shall paye or cause to be paid unto my sister Anne or to her heires the full sume of some poundes within one year next after the said Edward shall enjoye the said premises. And also that the said Edward or his heires shall paye or cause to be paid unto Margerye Martelle Parotye Martelle and Elizabeth Martelle my wives sisters fifty poundes of good and Lawfull money of England by equal portions to be paid unto them within one whole year next after the said Edward shall enjoye the said premises. And also that the said Edward or his heires shall paye or cause to be paid unto Sara Alquin my wyfe the full sume of thirty poundes of good and Lawfull money of England within one halfe year next after he shall enjoye the said premises. In witness whereof I the said Thomas Alquin have sette my hande and seale the daye and year first above declared. These being witnesses also abovenamed whiche have also sette their hande. The vijth
day of December in the five and forty year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth
by the grace of god of England France and Ireland Queen Defendress of the faith etc. I
William Caldecott of Bassingborne in the County of Cambridge and Diocess of Ely
yeoman being in perfect health and of good remembrance praise be unto Almighty god. Doe
make and ordayne this my present testament, touting here in my last will in manner and forme
following. First and above all thing I commend my Soule unto Almighty god my onely maker
and Redeemer. And my Bodie to be buried in the Churchyard in what parre hee shal please
god to call me. Item I give and bequeathe to the poore inhabitants of Bassingborne aforesaid or
forty shilling to be distributed amongst them at the day of my buriall and at the discretion of my
Exors. And twenty shilling yearly to be paid for and during the space of tenne years after
my decease unto the hands of the Churchwardens of the said towne of Bassingborne for the time
being to be distributed amongst the said poore inhabitants at the discretion of the said
Churchwardens ordely in whatsonholly dayes yearly for and during the said terme of tenne
years as my bonovoluntie so as the said Churchwardens doe make an acquittance yearly to my
Exors or his successor whoe shall paye the said twenty shilling to testifie the receipt thereof
to the use aforesaid. And my will is that if the Churchwardens shall at any tyme refuse thus to
doe that they shal paye my gift and bequest herein above mentioned shall from henceforth be void
Item I will and bequeathe unto John Barton my sister Adams eldest Sonne all my Apparell
whatsoever it be at the tyme of my decease to be delivered unto him within six weekes immediatly
after my decease. Item I give and bequeathe unto the said John Barton twenty pound to be
payde in lyke manner as above said within six weekes after my decease. Item I give unto William
Barton my said sister Adams her youngest Sonne tenne pound. Item I give unto Anne Adams
her daughter tenne pound to be payde unto them and every of them on the daye of thier severall
marriages or when they shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years whiche shall happen
first. And doe further will that thys my gift and bequest bequeathed unto them and every of them
shalbe equally divided betwene the survivors of them if it shall please god that any of them doe dye
and departe this mortall lyfe before they shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years or elly
be lawfully married. Item I give and bequeathe to every one of my sister Goodman her children
twenty pound apiece to be payde unto them on the daye of thier severall marriages or when they
shall accomplish the age of one and twenty years whiche shall be lawfully married. Item I give and
bequeathe to every survivor whiche of them shall happen first. Willing also that my gift and bequest
due unto them or any of them deceasing before the tyme of thier receipte shalbe equally divided
betwene the survivors of them in manner and forme as before rentid unto thier. Item I give
unto Clement Caldecott dwelling in St. James in London five pound to be payde unto him within
one moneth after my decease. Item I give unto Mathew Caldecott his eldest Sonne five pound
to be payde unto him within one moneth after my decease. I at the daye of his marriage or at the age
of one and twenty years whiche shall happen first. Item I give unto every one of his other children
twenty shilling apiece to be payde unto them at the daye of thier severall marriages or elly at the
full age of one and twenty years whiche shall happen first. And if any of them doe happen to dye
before any of the said dayes above rentid then to be divided equally amongst the survivors. Item
I give unto William Leelan dwelling in Salisbury in London forty shilling to be payde
unto him within one moneth after my decease. Item I give unto Jeffrey Nunn my man twenty
shilling to be payde unto him within one moneth after my decease. And five pound for more unto
him and his wyfe to be payde twenty shilling a year untill it be come forth. If he or his wyfe
